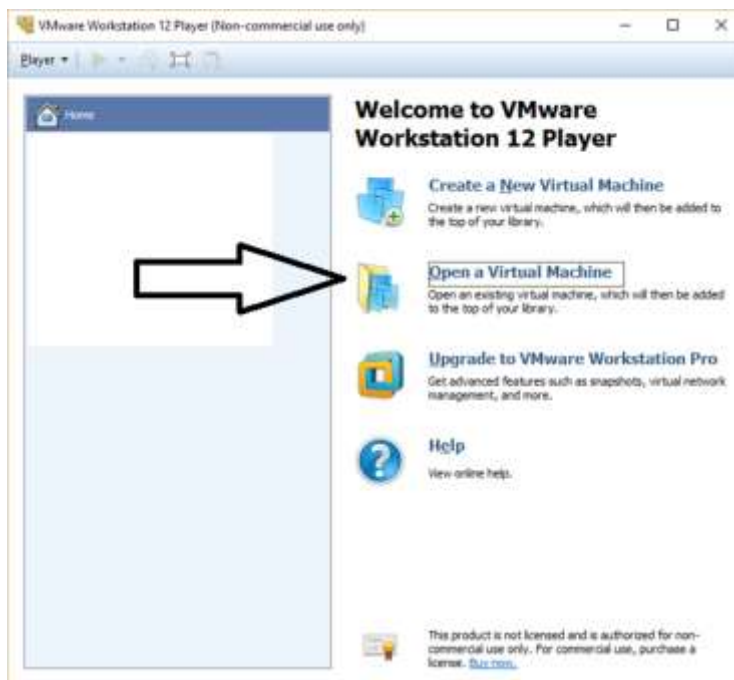


Getting started with the Linux Mint VM Demonstrated at InfoSec World

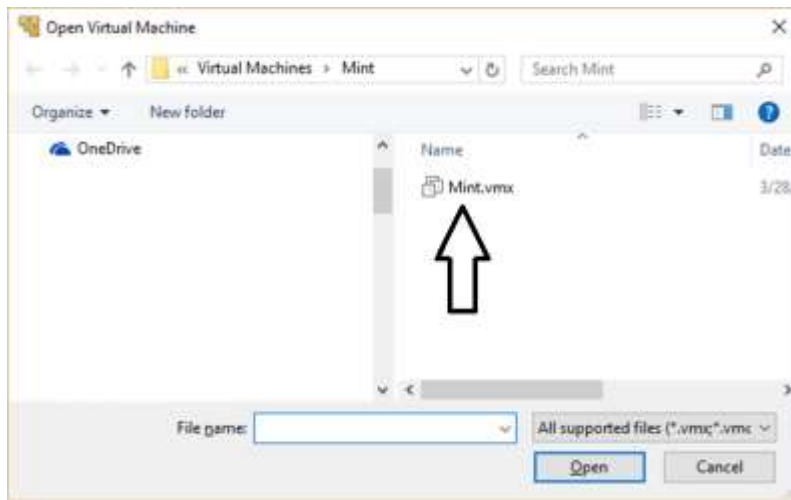
The VM included here is part of the demonstrations from InfoSec World 2016. There is no warranty or support and you use it at your own risk. You can visit www.CyberSecOlogy.com for similar content and ideas. You must unzip the VM prior to using it. If you are not familiar with how to unzip a file see winzip.com for software and details. The password to unzip the file is toor (four letters, all lowercase).

Note: If you are having trouble loading the VM on your *newer Windows system* you may need to enable virtualization in your BIOS. If you are not familiar with this VMWare has published a [knowledge base article here](#) outlining the process.

Step 1: Once you are ready, launch your VMPlayer Workstation software and click “Open Virtual Machine:”



Step 2: Next, navigate to where you unzipped the Mint directory and double click on the Mint.vmx file:



Step 3: When prompted, select the "I moved it" option.

Step 4: There will not be a prompt for a user name. The password is toor . Four letters, all lowercase. (root spelled backwards).
